



## Curriculum Information: Summer

### Year 1



Dear Parents/Carers,

During this term your child will be covering the topic

**'Around the World'**

*"My favourite thing is to go where I've never been"* Diane Areus.

English	<p>We will link our topic, Around the World , through most of our English lessons. We will begin with reading, writing and reciting Jungle poetry. We will write reports and fact files on animals around the world.</p> <p>We will be looking at fiction and non- fiction texts that link to different cultures and traditions around the world.</p> <p>Reading and comprehension will be focused on during our guided reading sessions and our daily reading. We will be focussing this term on prefixes and suffixes in our writing for when we are changing tenses, and we will continue with our phonics revision.</p>
Maths	<p>This term we will consolidate all the learning we have done this year. We will secure our number fluency up to 100, and use numbers to solve number problems – basic number sentences and missing number sentences.</p> <p>We will look at telling the time to o'clock and half past, and be confident drawing hands on a clock face.</p> <p>We will re-visit our learning on money, weight, capacity, and length, and how we can record those measurements.</p> <p>We will also work on positional language and 2D and 3D shapes.</p>
Computing	<p>This term, we will create a simple algorithm to achieve specific objective or target and then use algorithms to write a program to instruct a physical or onscreen device to achieve target. We will learn to test and debug programs.</p>
Topic: <b><i>Around the World</i></b>	<p><b>Geography, History</b></p> <p>In Geography, we will be naming and locating the world's seven continents and five oceans. We will identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles. We will be using world maps, atlases and globes to help us.</p> <p>In History, we will be looking at the lives of various different Kings and Queens; what did they do for us? What were their great achievements?</p>

Science	In Science, we will be looking closely at various different materials and their physical properties.		
RE	For our RE Curriculum we follow the Come & See scheme of work. We cover a topic every 4 weeks. Each term we cover 3 topics, therefore covering 1 and a half topics per half term.		
	Topic 1 – <b>Holidays and Holy Days</b>	Topic 2 – <b>Being Sorry</b>	Topic 3 – <b>Neighbours</b>
	As we reflect on Easter, the children will explore the meaning of holidays and that they represent a happy time in their lives. This will lead to the children understanding Holy days and that of Pentecost, the feast of the Holy Spirit. We will understand Ascension Day and Pentecost Day and what they mean to the Catholic Church.	During this topic we will be focussing on how we can make the right choices. We will explore how and why we might forgive someone when they have upset us. We will read the story of Jesus and Zacchaeus and discuss how Jesus looks for people making wrong choices and helps them to correct their ways.	Our final topic will be looking at ‘neighbours’. How we are a neighbour to everybody, particularly within our families and community. We will make links to how God loves all of us and Jesus wants us to respect and love our neighbours; just like the example He told in the ten commandments.
