Science:	Investigating Plants Identify and describe the functions of different parts of flowering plants; roots, stem/trunk, leaves and flowers Explore the requirements of plants for life and growth (air, light, water, nutrients from soil, and room to grow) and how they vary from plant to plant Investigate the way in which water is transported within plants Explore the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal Light and Shadow Recognise that they need light in order to see things and that dark is the absence of light Notice that light is reflected from surfaces Recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous and that there are ways to protect their eyes Recognise that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by a solid object Find patterns in the way that the size of shadows change
Computing:	Authoring: Children will create, organise, manipulate, store, retrieve, review and present varied digital content. They will use a range of digital sources, combining them, creating digital content.
